

# Step-by-step process to register a non-street legal golf car as an LSV in Florida, with a realistic timeline:

## Step 1:

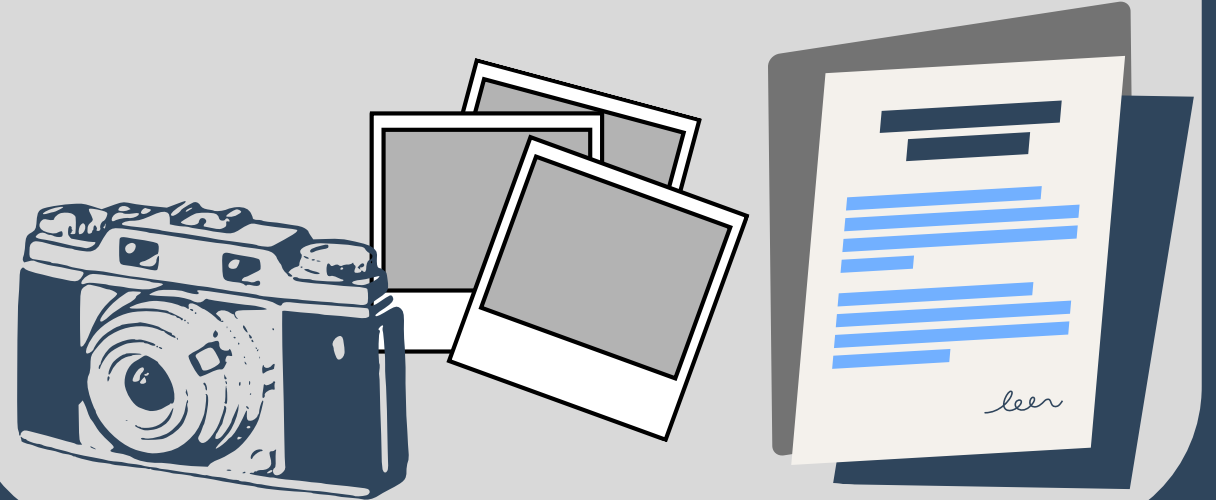
### Gather the required documents and photographs (1-2 days)

- Take photographs of the front, back, and both sides of the converted vehicle.
- Collect the following forms:
  1. Form [HSMV 84490](#) (Statement of Builder)
  2. Form [HSMV 86064](#) (Affidavit for Golf Cart Modified to a Low-Speed Vehicle)
  3. Form [HSMSV 82040](#) (Application for Title)
- Collect the following documents:
  1. Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin or a bill of sale for the golf cart
  2. Original bill(s) of sale or receipt(s) for all parts used to convert the golf cart to a low-speed vehicle
  3. Certified weight slip for the converted golf cart
  4. Proof of Florida insurance (minimum \$10,000 PDL and \$10,000 PIP)
  5. Sales tax or sales tax exemption information for all parts
  6. Identification – driver license, ID card or passport

## Step 2:

### Visit a Motorist Services Regional Office (1 day)

- Take all the required documents and photographs to a Motorist Services Regional Office.
- Pay the applicable fees, which include:
  1. Inspection fee
  2. Title fee
  3. Plate fee
  4. Initial registration fee, if applicable
  5. Registration fee (varies by weight of vehicle)



## Step 3:

### Wait for processing (4-6 weeks)

- The Motorist Services Regional Office will process your application and register your converted golf cart as an LSV.
- The timeline for this process is not specified, but it is likely to take several weeks.

## Additional Tips:

- Make sure the converted golf cart meets all LSV requirements before applying for registration.
- Keep copies of all the documents you submit.
